SECTION 1. Section 190-14 E. of the Code of the Village of Lyndonville is hereby changed and amended so as to provide for an increase in the rate charged per 1,000 gallons of ninety (90%) percent of metered water from \$2.70 to \$2.80. The rate schedule shall be as follows:

SECTION 2. Section 230-21 of the Code of the Village of Lyndonville is hereby changed and amended so as to provide for an increase in the water rates. The rate schedule shall be as follows:

A. Inside the Village: a minimum fee of Nineteen and 80/100 Dollars (\$19.80) for six thousand (6,000) gallons, plus Three and 30/100 Dollars (\$3.30) per one thousand (1,000) gallons thereafter.

B. Outside the Village: rural full-use metered service: A minimum fee of Twenty-Nine and 80/100 Dollars (\$29.80) for six thousand (6,000) gallons, plus Four and 95/100 Dollars (\$4.95) per one thousand (1,000) gallons thereafter.

C. Seasonal cottages: May 1 to November 1, water recorded at the master meter; billing June 1, September 1 and December 1.

D. Tank use: Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$8.00) per one thousand (1,000) gallons upon application to and approval of the Superintendent of Public Works.

SECTION 3. All local laws or regulations, or parts or portions thereof that conflict or are contrary to any provision of this local law are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This local law shall take effect June 1, 1995.

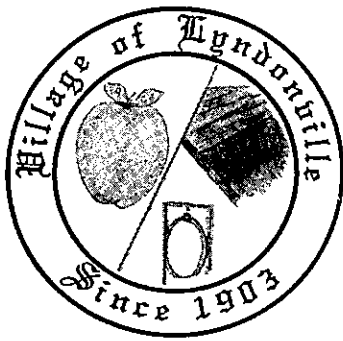
