PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

- Deborah Loke addressed the Board with her concerns regarding snowmobiles within the Village. Mrs. Loke noted she had sent several emails to Mayor Belson and Clerk-Treasurer Woodworth expressing her concerns as well as attached pictures. Mrs. Loke noted she was promised last year that "no snowmobiling" signs were going to be put up at all four of the Village limits this year and nothing had been done. Mrs. Loke noted that the Village of Lyndonville has a local law in effect since 2003 regulating snowmobiles within the Village. Mrs. Loke noted that her newly paved driveway is being destroyed by the snowmobiles driving down the sidewalks. Mrs. Loke asked the Village enforce the local law that regulates snowmobiles in the Village. Mayor Belson noted he has spoke with the Orleans County Sheriff's Department, New York State DEC and the New York State Police informing them of the Village local law and asked them to enforce it. Mrs. Loke asked the promised "no snowmobiling" signs be put in place.
- Bonadio Group Megan Anderson, CPA/Manger at the Bonadio Group presented the Board with the draft Financial Statements as of May 31, 2017. As noted in the management letter there were no significant audit findings. Ms. Anderson reviewed the reports briefly with the Board and offered to answer any questions. The Bonadio Group also advised the Board that the Sewer Fund should be a self-sustaining fund and they may need to consider another increase in the sewer rates in the future.
- Jim Bensley, Director of Orleans County Department of Planning and Development was asked by Mayor Belson to address the Board about creating a historic preservation district on Main Street in the Village. Director Bensley noted the Orleans County Planning Board may have to review and approve the historic preservation district given its on a State Highway. Director Bensley explained that the historic preservation district would create a tiered exemption only on any improvements made within the historic district, verses any exemptions on the overall assessment of the property. Director Bensley will look into the next process with the Orleans County Planning Board. Attorney Bogan will work on drafting the historic preservation district for approval at the next Board meeting to set a public hearing.
