"I wish to have these comments entered into the record for the public hearing:

The proposed 2021 budget increase will be the ninth one in the last ten years. This tax rate increase will result in my village property tax being \$2452.00 versus \$1355.00 in 2012. Trustee Wilson considers this a small increase for an average homeowner but I do not have an average home. Maintenance and upgrading things are a constant concern and expense. And for that the village takes full advantage of an increase in the assessment to charge more for a property that has been here since 1906.

The question is what has the village done to warrant the increase? From my viewpoint, nothing especially in the last four years.

Every new dollar out of my pocket for taxes must be replaced in another manner. Being on fixed incomes means one day you will run out of our money. You are not the only people making life unaffordable here.

I am not looking forward to the next four years under this leadership if nothing is to be done to control spending or get business to take root and add to the tax base. I will not allow my property to be like some in the village. However, I will avoid making any more major improvements for the town to increase my assessment. Do something positive for the village that all of you call home." Jim Tuk
