Sidewalk compliant letter – The Board received the following letter regarding the sidewalks at 106 S Main Street: July 7, 2024 To the Town of Lyndonville, NY or to Whom This May Concern, I am writing to convey our recent experience at this year's 4th of July parade. As my wife and I were walking (North) to the parade viewing areas, with the crowd, my wife caught a step in the sidewalk, tripped, fell and injured herself. She experienced facial and shoulder abrasions, bruising to the knee and wrists, a cut lip and possibly loosening a tooth (too soon to tell with all the swelling). Fortunately, she did not break anything. Not life-threatening injuries but injuries still. Assistance was offered by a few people as we got her back up on her feet which was greatly appreciated. As she was bleeding from the mouth, we retreated for medical attention The sidewalk section that I bring to your attention is on the West side of South Main Street, in front of a blue house (106 South Main Street). It's understood that sidewalks typically have irregular joints however, this section of sidewalk has existing ledges that are heaved or settled several inches. They pose a challenge to everyday walking, not to mention wheelchairs, those with walkers or the visually impaired. The following is information taken from the U.S. Department of Transportation Federal Highway Administration publication. A Guide for Maintaining Pedestrian Facilities for Enhanced Safety Link to the entire document here - https://higbways.dot.gov/safety/pedestrian-bioyclist/guida-maintaining-pedestrian-facilities-enhanced-safety Section 4 - Inspection, Accessibility, Compliance, Plans and Policies o 4.1.3 Inspection and Accessibility Accessibility Critoria Displacement/Changes in Level (includes faults and heaves): Surface discontinuities shall not exceed a half inch (13 millimeters). Vertical discontinuities between a quarter inch (6.4 millimeters) and half inch (13 millimeters) shall be beveled at 1:2 minimum. The bevel shall be applied across the entire level change. Walking back later in the day, after the parade, alone and with a clear view of the sidewalk at this location, these "ledges" can be seen and negotiated, however with several hundred people crowding the sidewalk enroute to the parade, the ledges are unseen and pose an obvious hazard and with no warning, you're tripped up and on your face. The intent of this letter is to bring this condition of the sidewalk to the town's attention for the purpose and hope of saving "the next guy" from the same fate as that of my wife.
